2. What do the pie charts tell us about the African-American population between 1990 and 2010?
3. How do Hispanic population numbers in 2010 compare to those in 1990?
4. What things do you believe the government should prioritize? [programs they should have; services they should provide, etc]
5. How might the changing demographics (different types of people) affect what the people want the government to do in number 4?
6. How does the fact that one group of people is growing in proportion affect their ability to have their concerns met by the government? [should groups growing get listened to more; are they]
7. How might a group experiencing a decline in percentage of the population try to hold on to their dominance over the government?

8. What do the changing numbers of Hispanics mean to the Democrats and Republicans?
9. In what ways do the changing populations remain irrelevant in elections? [think about who tends to vote and get involved in elections]
10. Government funding and political representation follows people so why is it important to conduct a census? (What does it tell us; What does the gov do with this info based on what it does/doesn't do)
11. Some population groups are hard to count so how can this cause the census to be misleading? (Who gets counted/not counted)
12. Given how population groups changed between 1990 and 2010, how do you see the 2020 numbers affecting our political system? [how do you think the gov will act in the future based on the numbers trend]
